## Region III St. Patrick's Day Party and Annual Meeting

Here's the skinny for all of you who were unable to join us at Megan Gallagher's Greystone Farm on March 13.

ACPS Region III Annual Meeting Minutes – March 14, 2011, Judy Brescia, Secretary

The meeting was called to order at 1:04 p.m. by Region III Chair Marian McEvelly. The ballots were collected from members who had elected to vote at the meeting. In order to vote for the Region Chair and the Regional Governor, a person had to reside in Region III and be a full paid up member of ACPS. All of the people present introduced themselves.

Linda Trimper gave a report on the boutique finances. In 2010, the Boutique grossed about \$3800. They had previously spent \$1200 to stock it and have since had to restock it but they now have a full inventory. Please contact Linda if you have ideas for new items you would like to see in the boutique.

Linda also gave the Treasurer's report. We have about \$7000. Last year's show made about \$80.

Marian urged everyone breeding and selling ponies to make sure that the ponies get registered and that the new members are urged to join ACPS.

Marynell Eyles announced that the *American Connemara* will be scaling back to four printed issues and the additional two will be available online. The decision was made due to the increasing printing and mailing costs. Marynell reminded everyone that that ACPS relies on membership dues and advertising to offset the publishing costs and encouraged everyone to renew their membership and advertise, if possible. ACPS dues can now be paid online.

Catherine Mack will be heading up the trail rides this year. The first one is planned for April 17, starting at Megan Gallagher's Greystone Farm, going over the mountain and stopping by the Mack's farm for refreshments before returning to Megan's. A second ride is planned for May 1 over the same course and additional rides will be posted in the newsletter.

The Centered Riding Clinic with Susan Harris currently has 12 paid entries. If anyone wants to participate, they are urged to get their entries in quickly, before it fills up.

Election Results – Anne Moe announced that Marian McEvelly had been re-elected as Region Chair with a term of one year, and Sandy McShea had been elected to serve as our Regional Governor with a term of three years. The terms commence in the fall at the ACPS Annual Meeting.

Horse Show – Les Cheek reported that the show will be held July 16-17 at Glenwood Park in Middleburg, VA as usual. Anne Moe did some analysis from years past and sought input from participants in order to restructure the show. As a result, we will only need one in-hand ring this year and the in-hand classes will be held on Saturday afternoon. The dressage will start in the morning. The Brescias will purchase three cabana tents for the show. In lieu of paying a facility rental, Region III will donate \$1,000 to Glenwood Park. Les reported that 2011 will be his ninth year of running the show and he will do it for ten years but he is officially retiring after the 2012 show!

## First Trail Ride: After the Storm

A lovely sunny day followed a torrential rain and wind storm, enticing five Region III members to venture out for a trail ride on Sunday, April 17 from Megan Gallagher's Greystone farm near The Plains. ### Ride the Middleburg Countryside from Glenwood

Have you ever surveyed the wonderful countryside while attending the Region III show and thought how great it would be to be able to hop on and ride through it all day? Here's your chance! The USTR 17th Annual Memorial Day Weekend Benefit Ride is just around the corner, Sunday, May 29 at Glenwood Park in Middleburg, VA. This is a fundraiser for worthy organizations; for instance, last year's beneficiaries were Horses for Heroes, the Equestrian Facilities Fund, and TROT Search and Rescue.

This is a terrific ride over the wonderfully scenic and private trails rarely open for public riding. You ride a marked course for 6 to 15 miles at your own pace. Trails are well marked and range from gently rolling mixed fields and woods to more aggressive hills and river crossings. Ride the trail(s) right for you—there is something for everybody! The ride fee is **\$40** and includes lunch. Registrations must be postmarked by May 23. The walk-in registration fee is **\$50** and lunch is not guaranteed.

We have a couple of spots we still need to fill—gate person for dressage on Saturday, and gate person and ringmaster for the in-hand classes, also on Saturday. If you are not showing, please consider volunteering. We can tell you everything you need to know! One big snag is that our food vendor for the past two years is no longer in business, and we are desperately searching for someone to take on this role.
